


Reusing plastics to create art

Subject Specific Vocabulary


collage	A form of artwork that is made by assembling different pieces to create a new, finished work of art.
composition	The arrangement of elements in a work of art.
abstract	Artwork made from colour, shape or pattern rather than objects that you recognise.
Installation art	Large scale assemblages or constructions of mixed media, often designed for a specific site or space.

Sticky Knowledge

- ❑ Collages can be made from a variety of materials such as paper, plastic and fabric.
- ❑ The World Economic Forum has predicted that the world's oceans will be filled with more plastic mass than fish mass by 2050.
- ❑ Marine plastic is a special threat because it does not fully degrade. Ocean dwellers, such as sea turtles and fish, can mistake the debris for food, leading to digestive issues and starvation.
- ❑ Artists have been using marine plastic as a medium to create artwork highlighting environmental concerns about plastic.
