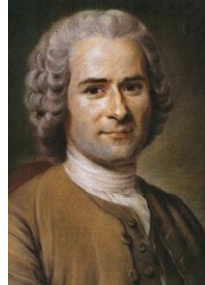


Year 2 Art: Nature

Explore nature through art

Words You Need To Know

artwork	A piece of art such as a painting, collage or sculpture.
natural objects	Things that are not manmade, but found in the world around us, such as stones, twigs, leaves, feathers and pine cones.
texture	How something feels when you touch it, for example, smooth, rough, bumpy, soft or spiky.
shape	The outward appearance of something.
pattern	An arrangement of shapes, lines or colours that are repeated.
print	A shape marked or pressed onto a surface.
materials	Anything an artist uses to create art.
observational drawing	Looking closely and carefully to draw what you can see, instead of drawing from imagination
air drying clay	A finely textured sticky substance that you can shape when it is wet.
rubbing	To make a copy of a textured surface by placing paper over it and rubbing the paper with a crayon.
