
- Use a timeline to understand when the Stone Age occurred compared to other historical periods.

### Sticky Knowledge

- The Stone Age period is said to have started around 3 million years ago when humans started to live in Europe.
- □ The Stone Age was followed by the Bronze Age period. This is when humans started to use metal.
- The Bronze Age was followed by the Iron Age when tools and weapons became more advanced and were used for farming, hunting and fighting.
- During the Palaeolithic Age (old Stone Age), people gathered food by hunting wild animals and birds, fishing, and collecting fruits and nuts.
- During the Neolithic Age (towards end of the Stone Age), the humans formed settled communities and domesticated plants and animals for the first time in history.
- Skara Brae is an archaeological site found on the Orkney Islands in Scotland. It is a Stone Age village that has been well preserved.
- □ Stonehenge is a famous Stone Age monument in Wiltshire.

## Chronology



<u>Skara Brae</u> - Skara Brae is a stone-built Neolithic settlement, located on the largest island in the Orkney Islands in Scotland. It is one of the best preserved Stone Age settlements in Europe and gives us a good idea of what Stone Age Britain was like.





**Stonehenge-** A prehistoric monument in Wiltshire, England. It consists of a ring of standing stones with each stone about 4 metres high, 2 metres wide and weighing about 25,000 kilograms!
