SUBJECT SPECIFIC VOCABULARY

Close Up	The camera is hand-held, is close to the subject and the camera is moved to keep the subject in shot
Frames	Individual pictures in a sequence of images
High Angle	Makes a person look smaller than they are
Long Shot	Filming one person, showing their whole body and where they are
Low Angle	Makes a person look bigger than they are
Moving subject	A person moving from one place to another
Mid Range	Filming one person with some background detail
Normal Angle	Makes a person look their actual size
Pan	Move camera side to side
Panning	The camera is hand-held and the camera moves to show different things
Side by Side	Filming two people at the same time
Static Camera	Camera stay in same position normally using a tripod
Tilt	Move camera up and down
Talking head	The camera is in a fixed position to keep it still You can see the subject's head and body
Zoom	Close up video so you can see the subject in greater detail

Video is the recording, reproducing, or broadcasting of moving visual images.

In video production, a storyboard is a plan. Each section includes an image showing what the scene will look like and notes explaining the content.

Video can be improved through reshooting or editing. Video shows sequence and progression with a clear beginning, middle, and end

- Use appropriate filming technique, capturing the scenes from the storyboard
- Captured audio is clear
- Video has been edited to join scenes, matching the storyboard
