WALKING BUS

In the past, we have had a very successful walking bus at Thames View and we'd like to give the children the opportunity to take part again. We had three routes coming in to School three times a week, one from Splashes car park, one from the Litchfield Road/ Hereford Close area and the last one was from Holmoaks/High Elms area. Children were taken to the meeting points at a prearranged time and walked in to school together by either their own parents or the parents who were volunteer Walking Bus Coordinators. All Coordinators are trained in road safety by Medway Council and are DBS checked.

The children who take part are given termly rewards by the KM Walk to School charity and can collect stickers to show how many times they have walked with the group. Not only is it good for the children to walk together, it eases car congestion around school and is environmentally friendly.

During the afternoon of Wednesday, 9th October, the Year 6 children hosted their annual Harvest Tea for members of the local community. The children had planned their menus, sent out their invites, brought in the food and decorated their tables. At Thames View Primary School we are taking the following positive steps to ensure an improvement in our overall attendance figures. **Our overall target for this year is 97**%

- Presenting individual 100% attendance certificates at Celebration Assemblies at the end of Terms 2, 4 and 6.
- Presentation of 'Attendance Ted' to the Key Stage 1 class with the highest level of punctuality and attendance each week, in the Friday Celebration Assembly;
- Awarding a 'Freedom Friday', to any class with a weekly punctuality and attendance figure of 97% and above with no recorded late arrivals, which means the whole class can wear their own clothes to school on the following Friday.
- Sharing attendance and punctuality data, hints and tips along with news of the classes with the best attendance on the board outside the main office.
- A new Pastoral Support Link Worker offering attendance clinics to parents/carers who experience difficulties in getting their child(ren) to school regularly and on time.
- Actively using 'Pupil Voice' to seek ideas and feedback from pupils on attendance and punctuality systems and rewards.

We appreciate your ongoing support with this aspect of Thames View Primary School improvement, however, if your child in genuinely unwell, please remember to follow the guidance set out below

Pupil Absence Due To Sickness

If your child is absent from school it is very important that you contact the school office as soon as possible on the first day of non-attendance to give the reason for their absence. It is important that if your child is suffering from sickness and/or diarrhoea they **should not** return to school until **48 hours after** the symptoms cease. This will stop the risk of infection to other children and staff. Thank you.



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Health and Safety Reminders

• Please be reminded that Thames View Primary School is still a '**Nut-Free' Zone.** Please would you be vigilant about the ingredients in the food in your child's lunch boxes, the food that you are eating on the site and any food that you send in to school. Please be mindful that some chocolate spreads also contain nuts.





Just a little reminder that children **should not** use the play equipment on either playground before school begins and if children come to school on bikes or scooters, they should **not** ride them around the playground when they arrive, as there are often very little children on the playground.

The bike and scooter rack, which was donated to us by a school in Maidstone, has now been installed on the KS1 playground.
