
# Read, Read, Read















# World Book Day 2022


Keep an eye out on the school's social media page and the next newsletter, where we will share the most unusual places and award the winners. What is the prize you ask? Yes – it's a book!

Here are some suggestions for any reads that you may find useful in supporting your child and helping them navigate the many changes they are going through.


