## Key Vocabulary

<b>Land use</b>	The human use of land
<b>Sketch Maps</b>	a map which is drawn from observation rather than to exact scale
<b>Cartographer</b>	a person who creates maps.
<b>Agriculture</b>	Land used for farming
<b>Greenbelt</b>	An area of land that is not allowed to be built on by law.
<b>Rural</b>	relating to the country, country people or life, or agriculture.
<b>Urban</b>	areas where many people live and work, resulting in very dense development
