# Our Behaviour System

## 'Paw Patrol'

From September, we have updated our behaviour policy in line with our new inclusion hub. The new system is 'paw patrol' which works with our dog mentors. All children have four coloured Cards; red, yellow, green and blue. Red is a consequence to two yellows (like football) or is a result of a serious incident, which is then dealt with by a member of our Senior Leadership Team or the Head of School. Yellow is a warning card. Green is for having a great day (following our behaviour rules and working hard) and blue is for exceptional behaviour or work. Children who earn a blue card get to spend time with the dog mentors if they would like to.

The colour system is on the wall in every classroom from Nursery to Year 6 and is a visual learning tool for all of our children to easily see and to allow them to be responsible for their own behaviour! It also allows for consistency across the whole school as every class uses the system. If any parents would like a set of cards to use at home, please let Mrs. Flynn, our wellbeing coordinator know.
