

Wallpaper design

Subject Specific Vocabulary

pattern	Repeated decorative designs.
materials	Anything an artist uses to create art.
fabric	Cloth or woven material.
block print	Hand print using carved wooden printing blocks.
monoprint	A form of printmaking where the image can only be made once, unlike most printmaking which allows for multiple originals.
wallpaper	Paper that is pasted in vertical strips over the walls of a room to provide a decorative surface.
natural dye	Dyes derived from a plant or animal origin such as leaves, flowers, insects or shellfish.
craftsman	A person who is skilled, especially someone who makes things by hand.
negative space	The space around the object rather than the object itself.
background	The area of the picture furthest away from the viewer.

Sticky Knowledge

- William Morris was born in Walthamstow in East London in 1834 and he died in 1896.
- William Morris is very famous for his wallpaper designs. He created some beautiful designs.
- William Morris was inspired by nature.
- William Morris made designs of floral patterns (patterns inspired by flowers and plants) that could be repeated many times by block printing techniques on large pieces of paper to make patterned wallpaper.
